COVID-19 is still in the community:

- Students that test positive should stay home for 5 days and can return on day 6 with a mask.
- Day 0 is when symptoms started, or if no symptoms the day of the positive test.
- If a student is exposed, it is recommended to wear a mask for 10 days. They can remain in school if they are symptom free.
- If someone in a household tests positive, the student can attend school. It is recommended to wear a mask for 10 days. Day 0 is the day of last exposure.
- We have COVID rapid tests available.
