Traci has written numerous children's, middle grade, and young adult fiction, including *Classified: The Secret Career of Mary Golda Ross, Cherokee Aerospace Engineer*.

Bestselling author Traci Sorell writes inclusive, award-winning historical and contemporary fiction and nonfiction in a variety of formats for young people. She is a two-time Sibert Medal and Orbis Pictus honoree and award-winning audiobook narrator and producer. Her first five books have received awards from the American Indian Library Association. Other accolades include Boston Globe-Horn Book Honor, International Literacy Association's Social Justice Literature Award Winner, Reading the West's Picture Book Winner, and many best-of and notables lists. In 2023, she shares *Contenders: Two Native Baseball Players, One World Series*, a Kirkus Reviews starred nonfiction picture book biography illustrated by Arigon Starr, and *Mascot*, a middle grade fiction novel-in-verse co-authored with Charles Waters.

During the program, there will be a book discussion followed by a Q&A and a book signing. The Mazza Museum will have a selection of Traci's books available for purchase. WBGU-PBS will be providing copies of *Classified* to the first 100 people at this event.
