If you are ordering an item to be worn as part of the school uniform, please make sure you are choosing a navy or white polo, quarter zip or sweatshirt with the diamond shaped logo on it. Most of these items for sale are spirit wear and not dress code.

A good rule of thumb is that dress code approved items have the diamond shaped logo. We also permit students to wear the old school logo with the two headed lion design in its different formats. Anything other than these two designs are spirit wear:



Another good check is if it says "Lions" it's spirit wear and not dress code. We know there has been some confusion this year, but please plan ahead for next year accordingly.
